supported by her husband and four grown children. This is her 10th year teaching, having previously taught in middle school and high school. She is excited to be the Lead teacher for the Middle School program.




Deb Varnado


Grace Montessori Academy will be picking up the bibs for our school and placing them in your child's backpack.
